



PRESS RELEASE: PEER-TO-PEER LOCATION RETURN

The AirFlare team is pleased to announce a planned release of Peer-to-Peer Location Return – the ability for an AirFlare user to determine the location of another AirFlare user (example a friend or family member), and to view their location on a map.

Assistance calls into search teams are frequently initiated by friends and loved ones who have been separated without incident. Peer-to-Peer Location Return provides a powerful mechanism for parents to keep track of their kids, for separated parties to reunite, or for emergency contacts to keep track of a parties' progress on a long outing, without necessitating search team involvement.

Additionally, given the increased frequency of tree-well and other snow suffocation incidents in recent years, Peer-to-Peer Location Return offers another powerful tool to skiers and boarders to keep track of and locate partners in need of immediate assistance where time is critical.

Peer-to-Peer Location return requires AirFlare users to pre-approve location return requests between parties, and requires both phones (requester and responder) to be within cellular service for location to be returned to requestor. If the responder's phone is out of cell service, the request will be queued and will return its location when the phone returns to cell service.

Peer-to-Peer Location Return is scheduled for release in August 2019.
